Immigration Corner

Well, it's almost the middle of April, and now's the time that many of you are firming up your summer plans! In all your planning, don't forget the following immigration responsibilities:

- 1. Report any address changes:**
Are you planning on moving off campus this summer? Are you spending most of the summer out of state? If you leave your current residence for more than 4 weeks, you are required to report your new US address to the ISP Office. Not doing so could negatively affect your immigration status!
- 2. No Off-Campus Work:**
Remember that unless you hold a valid EAD card from the U.S. Government, international students are not allowed to work off-campus . . . even during the summer. Instead, think of the summer vacation as plenty of time to catch up on that beauty rest . . .
- 3. Apply for OPT:** Last call for OPT Applications! If you're planning on graduation this May, be sure to apply for OPT as soon

as possible! You will not be eligible to apply after May 19th.

- 4. Check your documents before traveling:** If you plan to leave the U.S. this summer, please be sure your I-20 has been signed within the last 6 months and your visa and passport are valid.

Feel free to stop by the ISP Office for a [Travel Checklist](#) to be sure you have everything you need to return safely to the U.S.
