Check-In: *All students must attend.* You will pick up your internet and phone information, mailbox combination, parking decal, finalize account details, receive information about health insurance, take your student I.D. picture, get your Barnabas Group assignment, and meet some of your student leaders. After check-in is completed you will have time to move into your room if living in the residence halls. You must be cleared in order to move into the dorms.

Commuter Gathering: While residents are moving into the dorms come and meet some of your fellow commuters. You may even find someone to carpool with.

President's Welcome: *All students must attend.* President John Derry will welcome you to the *Hope* community and offer further information about New Student Orientation and the University.

Barnabas Groups: *All students must attend.* This peer mentoring program provides support and encouragement for all of *Hope's* new students. You will be assigned to a group of 10-15 new students and one returning student who will act as your group leader. Your group will meet periodically to help you navigate through your first semester at *Hope*, integrate into the community, and get plugged into activities, programs, and groups on campus.

College 101 – Parent's Orientation: While the students meet with their Barnabas Groups hear from the President and meet some of our faculty, staff, and administrators. We will have raffles and gifts we have selected just for you.

Celebration: We want to come together to celebrate in worship, welcoming our new students and families while asking God to bless the coming semester. This time serves as the parents' closing session and we ask that you help us to better serve our community by filling out the parent survey.

Academic Orientation/Panel: *All students must attend.* You will receive your degree audit sheet, sign up for advising and receive other important academic information. You will have a chance to meet faculty members, hear remarks from the Academic Dean, and sign-up for an advising time in order to register for classes.

Academic Advisement: *All students must attend.* You will meet with your faculty advisor to choose classes for the spring. If you participated in early registration you do not need to attend.

Student Life Orientation: *All students must attend.* The Student Affairs Department will introduce themselves and discuss the services and opportunities offered on campus to all students.

Online Registration: *All students must attend.* Course registration will take place online at <http://my.hiu.edu>. Clearance from the Business Office is required. If you participated in early registration you do not need to register at this time.

College Student Inventory: *All students must attend.* CSI helps the University to get to know you better and identifies ways that we may better support you as a student.

Social and Recreational Events: There will be a number of social and recreational events planned for you during NSO. Please refer to your schedule for times and locations. Attending these events is a great way to relax, meet other students and enjoy your first few days at *Hope!* We encourage all students to remember that socializing is an important part of your college experience and these are connections that can last a lifetime.
