REPORTING OF CRIMINAL ACTIONS OR EMERGENCIES

To report a crime or medical emergency in case of serious injury or loss of consciousness, members of the campus community should call 911. All crime victims and witnesses are strongly encouraged to immediately report crimes to Campus Security and the appropriate police agency. Campus Security should be notified by calling extension 7333, as quickly as possible, so they may be of assistance with police, fire, or medical emergency personnel, and in order to assure timely warning notices on-campus and timely disclosure of crime statistics.

Reports of crimes are to be filed with Campus Security. The University does not have procedures for voluntary, confidential reporting of crime statistics. Violations of the law will be referred to law enforcement agencies and when appropriate, to the University Disciplinary Committee for review. In the event that a situation arises, either on or off campus, that, in the judgment of the Director of Security, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide “timely warning” will be issued through e-mail announcements, the posting of flyers, in-class announcements, or other appropriate means.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AUTHORITY

Campus Security has the authority to ask persons for identification and to determine whether individuals have lawful business at Hope International University. The Campus Security staff are not certified or sworn peace officers. Criminal incidents are referred to the local police. Arrests are made by the Fullerton Police Department, and are usually accompanied by a member of security or the University staff. Campus security reports all incidents to the Director of Security and/or to the Fullerton Police Department, if necessary.

MAINTENANCE AND SECURITY OF CAMPUS FACILITIES – ACCESS TO CAMPUS FACILITIES

Most campus buildings and facilities are accessible to members of the campus community, guests and visitors during normal hours of operation (typically 7:00 AM to 10:00 PM, Monday through Friday) and special events. Campus buildings are secured on the weekends, unless otherwise posted due to special events. The campus is an “open” campus in an urban setting with pedestrian and vehicular traffic primarily associated with the adjacent California State University at Fullerton.

Hope International University maintains a very strong commitment to campus safety and security. Parking lots, pedestrian walkways and building exteriors are lighted. A routine check of interior and exterior lighting on campus is conducted by the Department of Operations. Members of the campus community are encouraged to report any exterior or interior lighting deficiencies to the Campus Safety and Security office at extension 7333, (714-654-9273) or to the Operations Department at extension 2545. Exterior doors on campus buildings are locked and secured each evening by the security staff while on campus rounds. Door and security hardware operating deficiencies are reported by these staff members whenever possible.

SECURITY AWARENESS AND CRIME PREVENTION

It is the philosophy of Hope International University that we would much rather prevent crimes from occurring than react to them after the fact. A primary vehicle for accomplishing this is a crime prevention program. Hope's crime prevention program is based upon the dual concepts of minimizing opportunity for criminal activity, and personal responsibility. Personal security is the responsibility of every community member, and students, faculty, and staff alike should employ common sense safety and security behaviors. Avoid walking alone after hours around campus. A security officer will provide an escort upon your request.

It is the policy of Hope International University to maintain a safe working and learning environment, free from harassment of its students, employees, and those who apply for student and employee status. Possession, distribution, or use of drugs or alcohol; possession or use of an explosive, dangerous chemical, or deadly weapons on campus property or at a University campus function; and harassment, including sexual harassment, are prohibited and are subject to disciplinary action up to and including dismissal or termination of employment. The possession, sale, manufacture or distribution of any controlled substance is illegal under both state and federal law. Such laws are strictly enforced. Violators are subject to University disciplinary action, criminal prosecution, fine and imprisonment.

The University has developed a program to prevent the illicit use of drugs and the abuse of alcohol by students and employees. The program provides services related to drug use and abuse including dissemination of informational materials, educational programs, counseling services, referrals and University disciplinary actions. Services may be accessed through various areas of the University.

- Alcohol and Drug Education – Lifetime Health and Fitness course
- Counseling Services – Student Affairs and Student Life personnel, Hope Counseling Center
- Referrals – Student Affairs and Student Life personnel
- University Disciplinary Actions – Faculty/Student Judicial Review Committee, Vice President of Student Affairs, Vice President of Business and Finance

SEXUAL ASSAULT PREVENTION AND RESPONSE

The University is concerned about any allegations of sexual assault. Any person who has experienced such a violation should report the situation in a timely manner to a Residence Life Coordinator, the Director of Student Life, the Vice President of Student Affairs, or the Vice President of Business and Finance, who will take action to ensure that appropriate medical and counseling services are provided. Time is a critical factor for evidence collection and preservation that may be necessary to the proof of criminal sexual assault. Filing a report with a University officer will not obligate the victim to prosecute. However, the University will report and cooperate with the appropriate law enforcement authorities that have the right and responsibility to act in response to law violations committed on the university premises and/or by a member of the university community. The University will report complaints of sexual assault that involve minors to the appropriate law enforcement authority in accordance with California law. Victims of sexual assault may notify the proper law enforcement authorities themselves or may ask to be assisted by campus authorities in notifying such authorities. The University will notify student victims of sexual assault of any reasonably available options in changing their academic or living situations if so requested.

Disciplinary proceedings involving complaints of sexual assault are addressed in Student and Employee Handbooks. In accordance with federal regulations regarding disciplinary resolutions of sexual assault cases, both the accuser and the accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during disciplinary hearings and to be informed of the outcome. University policy provides, in part, that the accused and the accuser will each be allowed to choose one person who has had no formal legal training to accompany them throughout the hearing.

In accordance with the Campus Sex Crimes Prevention Act of 2000, which amends the Jacob Wetterling Crimes Against Children and Sexually Violent Offender Registration Act, the Jeanne Clery Act, and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, Hope International University is providing a link to the State of California Sex Offender Registry. This act requires institutions of higher education to issue a statement advising the campus community where law enforcement information provided by a State concerning registered sex offenders may be obtained. It also requires sex offenders already required to register in a State to provide notice of each institution of higher education in that State at which the person is employed, carries a vocation, or is a student. The Sex Offender Registry maintained by the California Department of Justice may be accessed via Internet at www.meganslaw.ca.gov. Registry information provided under this section shall be used for the purposes of the administration of criminal justice, screening of current or prospective employees, volunteers or otherwise for the protection of the public in general and children in particular. Unlawful use of the information for purposes of intimidating or harassing another is prohibited and willful violation is subject to criminal prosecution and civil liability.

CRIME STATISTICS

The University collects and publishes crime statistics in compliance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act. This report is prepared in cooperation with local law enforcement agencies surrounding our main campus and alternate sites, and with the offices of the Vice President of Student Affairs and the Vice President of Business and Finance. This report is distributed to all enrolled students and personnel through campus mail, or by email notification. Prospective students or employees are provided a copy of the report upon request.
