# Renowned Business Leader Addresses Spring Commencement



**Mr. Jerre L. Stead**, Chairman of IHS, Inc. and former Chairman and CEO of Ingram Micro, was the commencement speaker at Hope International University's 81<sup>st</sup> Commencement ceremony on Saturday, May 20, 2006. A renowned business leader, Mr. Stead delivered an inspiring congratulatory speech to *Hope's* recent graduates.

Stead shows a relentless commitment to the success of others and holds a wealth of experience, expertise, and success as a global business leader. *Hope's* President, Dr. John Derry, remarked "He (Stead) is one who has chosen to use the talents and abilities that God has given him in the business world. In doing so, he has served as a role model of professional integrity and ethics."

Stead's commencement speech served as a timeless message to all at the ceremony as he shared a few of his personal values, such as treating all people with equal dignity and respect, continued learning, spiritual and physical growth, and teaching others. He emphasized using what he refers to as "The Three P's — Power, Permission, and Protection: Power to do what you know will be right; the permission to continue to learn; and the protection that when you make mistakes, you won't make the same one next time."

This year’s special guest, **Michael Reagan**, was the keynote speaker. Michael Reagan, eldest son of former President Ronald Reagan, is heard daily by over 5 million listeners through his nationally syndicated radio talk program, “The Michael Reagan Show.”

Reagan also serves on the board for The John Douglas French Alzheimer’s Foundation and has authored many successful books including his best-selling autobiography, “On the Outside Looking In,” and “The Common Sense of An Uncommon Man: The Wit, Wisdom and Eternal Optimism of Ronald Reagan.” His latest book, “Twice Adopted,” is a moving testimony of how Reagan found his true identity in Christ.

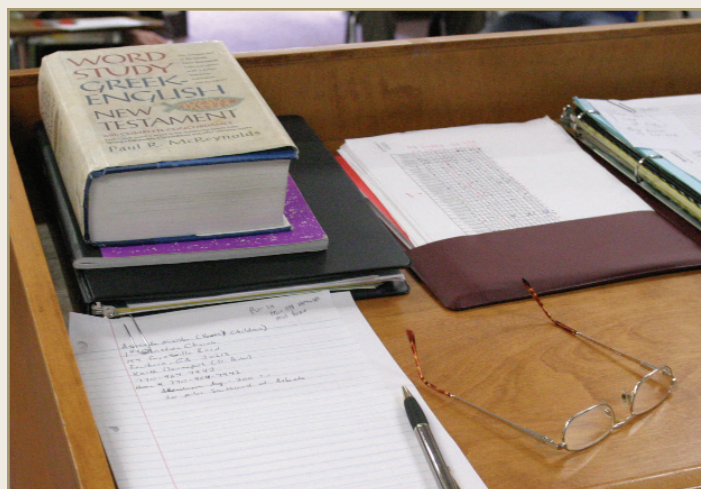

# Strengthening Our Ministry Programs

One of the Core Values of the University is “to conduct research in order to act as a change agent in communicating the relevance of the Gospel.” To this end, *Hope* conducted extensive research into ministry needs for the 21<sup>st</sup> century. Over 500 active pastors, missionaries, ministry specialists, and educators shared their insights through focus groups and a detailed online survey. Participants represented a variety of geographic regions (30 states and 14 countries), age groups (20 to 65+), genders (61% men and 39% women), and churches (memberships under 100 to over 3000, with 28% of respondents from congregations of 1200+). President Derry, Board members, Deans, and Faculty analyzed the data as a basis for curriculum revision. The resulting changes have strengthened the ministry programs in all three schools:

**Pacific Christian College** has added new Bible requirements and ministry electives to its Biblical Studies Major. PCC now requires at least one Family Ministry course in all seven of its church ministry programs. The emphasis on ministering to young people within the context of their family networks is reflected in new names for two programs: the Children and Family Ministry Major, and the Youth and Family Ministry Major.



In addition, all PCC Church Ministry Majors are required to participate in an extensive Practicum (Internship). Supervised by mentors on the field, their education in the classroom finds expression in a church setting. Practicum is a minimum of 400 supervised hours which students can fulfill in ministries close to the University or in settings throughout the world.

The **School of Graduate Studies** has developed new tracks for the Master of Arts program focusing on foundational theology, listening to God, world religions, church business and finance, and other felt needs. SGS has completely transformed its Intercultural Studies program, putting increased emphasis on key aspects of missional theology and cross-cultural communication.

The **School of Professional Studies** specializes in equipping working adults through online and on-site programs. SPS has redesigned its entire Christian Ministry Major to emphasize Bible study for personal growth and ministry action; effective ministry within diverse cultural contexts; spiritual and emotional maturity of the minister; and a six-month field practicum under experienced ministry mentors.

All of *Hope*'s ministry programs are accredited by both the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC) and the Association for Biblical Higher Education (ABHE).

## ORANGE COUNTY TEACHER OF THE YEAR

**Lorri Varela (M.Ed. '02)** has been teaching second grade in the Ladera Palma School in La Habra, CA since 1990. Throughout her career, Varela has focused on working with students who have difficulty speaking English. Varela was selected as the La Habra City School District Teacher of the Year and also the Orange County Teacher of the Year for 2005.

Not only did the Master of Education program train Varela to be a better teacher, but it also showed her how important it is to have Christian teachers in the public school system. In her own words, "there are so many students that may never hear God's word or be witnessed to anywhere other than in my classroom." At *Hope* she was encouraged to be the salt and light in her school community and to be a Godly example to her students. When she was twice chosen to be Teacher of the Year, she prayed that God would receive the glory through her awards. "In every speech and essay, I tried to express all that God has done in my life to make me the teacher I am today. I am very grateful to *Hope* for their part in training me as a servant in education."

# SAN BERNARDINO COUNTY TEACHER OF THE YEAR

“The mediocre teacher tells. The good teacher explains. The superior teacher demonstrates. The great teacher inspires.” – William Arthur Ward

In everything he does, PCC graduate **Bill Lassiter (B.A. '97)** strives to be a great teacher. He is currently teaching 4th grade at The Ontario Center School in the Cucamonga School District. In 1998, he began teaching at The Ontario Center School where he has held multiple positions of leadership, including Teacher-in-Charge, Grade Level Leader, Student Achievement Instructional Leader, Beginning Teachers Support and Assessment Program (BTSA) Support Provider, and Cucamonga Teachers Association Vice-President. He has also been named Teacher of the Year for The Ontario Center School in June of 2004, the Cucamonga School District in July of 2004, and San Bernardino County in September of 2004. Lassiter is now in the running for the California State Teacher of the Year award.

When asked how he feels about teaching, Lassiter says, “I love my job. In fact, I do not even consider it a ‘job.’ I get to do

something so profound and important every single day. I get to mold, shape, and inspire children. Some people build houses. Others build bridges. Still others build relationships. I get to build the youth for the future.” Lassiter believes that education is a three-part process including enhancing the learner by giving him/her the skills to solve

problems in the world as we know it today, enhancing the learner by giving them knowledge of the forces that shape this world, and showing the learner ways to apply the knowledge and skills acquired and to pass them on. According to Lassiter, “Good teaching requires the teacher to get down on his students’ level and look at life through their eyes.”

Lassiter feels as if God has called him into the field of education and recognizes that his education at *Hope* gave him that start. “*Hope* helped me with a foundation that I use in the classroom today. That foundation is the understanding

of the fact that my vocation can be, should be, and is, my mission field. I know every day I enter the classroom that I am doing God’s work. I may be the only Jesus that my students ever see, so I need to make it count!”

# OUTSTANDING FIRST YEAR TEACHER

**Christie Murray (Grimstad, B.A.'98; M.Ed.'05)** teaches first grade at Thomas Edison Elementary School in Anaheim, California. She has been teaching since 2002 and earned the prestigious Outstanding First Year Teacher Recognition Award for the 2002-03 school year from the California Association for Employment in Education.

Murray was chosen for the award because of her excellent behavior management skills, along with her ability to communicate with the parents of her students through various parent education nights that she organized during her first year in the classroom. “*Hope* did an amazing job preparing me for a career in education. The classes gave me not just the head knowledge, but also practical hands-on experience in the classroom. I was nervous my first few weeks of teaching until I realized I really did know what I was doing,” says Murray.

“Education is not an easy profession, but it is a rewarding profession,” Murray adds. “Everyday I am in a classroom with students who are hurting either physically, mentally, or emotionally. I have the opportunity to show love and acceptance to them that they may not experience elsewhere. I have the opportunity to encourage, love, and allow them to take risks in learning that will affect the rest of their lives.”

Before teaching, Murray worked as an editor at Insight for Living and Entrepreneur.com. She returned to school in 2000 to earn her teaching credential, then her Master of Education from *Hope*. She has many fond memories of her educational experiences. “I was an undergrad at Pacific Christian College before receiving my credential and my Master of Education. The faculty is top-notch. They work hard to make sure students learn and become the best they can possibly be,” says Murray.



# SAN DIEGO COUNTY TEACHER OF THE YEAR

**Linda Foote (B.A. '74)** has been described as someone who has a passion to touch the souls of every student she meets and provide them with a safe place to learn, grow, and become the best they can be. Foote is currently an Instructional Technology Specialist for the Poway Unified School District. In 1998 she was nominated as both the Poway Unified and the San Diego County Teacher of the Year.

Her career began as a student teacher in the Placentia School District after which she began substitute teaching in the Long Beach and Bellflower Unified School districts. After the birth of their first of three children, Foote took time off to raise her kids. During the sixteen years that she was home, Foote continued to teach at church and to write curriculum for various programs in the district. In 1992 she earned an elementary (Multiple Subject) credential in addition to her secondary one. In 1999 she moved to the district office as an Instructional Technology Specialist and began teaching teachers on how to integrate technology into their classrooms. She also assists teachers in assessing student performance and setting class goals through the use of technology.

After graduating from high school as the valedictorian, Foote's teachers were apprehensive about her attending a small Christian college but later relented saying that they were amazed at the quality of education she had received.

Foote used her time at *Hope* to grow and mature academically, spiritually, and emotionally because of the professors who opened their homes to show an example of a healthy family and how God's principles are lived out. Many of those professors are still impacting

her life and still teaching her lessons all these years later. Professors like John Koekkoek, Paul McReynolds, and Gary Tiffin came along beside Foote and mentored her through her schooling. Now she provides a safe and loving classroom for her students to find encouragement and hope. She daily prays for her students and shows Christ's love through her actions. She reminds future teachers that, "teaching is a lot of hard work, but it is one of the greatest opportunities in the world to serve God and pour His love into the lives of hundreds of students and their families."

# Athletics at *Hope*

## Men's Volleyball Earns National Ranking During 2006 Campaign

When the Royals won this season, they did so in dominating fashion-*Hope* swept its opponents 3-0 in eleven of its fifteen victories.

Leading the way for the Royals during the 2006 season was senior captain Soren Schneider (Nordhausen, Germany), who tallied 337 kills, good enough for a 4.62 kills per game average. Junior Kaimana Kamalani (Hanalei, HI) also provided a powerful offensive presence for *Hope*, recording 206 kills (3.07 per game). Junior Dante Jones (Inglewood, CA) notched 182 kills (2.39 per game) while hitting .502 for the season, and he was just as impressive on defense, leading the Royals with 67 blocks (22 solo).

After solid play in the Lindenwood Tournament in St. Charles, Missouri in February, the Royals garnered a 5<sup>th</sup> place national ranking in the Tachikara NAIA Men's Top 10 Poll. During the four-

match weekend against some of the nation's toughest squads, the Royals battled and fought against the odds, finishing the tournament with a 2-2 record. The Royals topped 5<sup>th</sup>-ranked Missouri Valley and 6<sup>th</sup> ranked Graceland.

"Dante Jones and Soren Schneider had All-American weekends," said head coach Wes Schneider after his team's impressive play in Missouri. "They provided solid hitting, blocking, and serving, while Mike Murphy (Dana Point, CA) set such a balanced offense that we often had 4 or 5 players in double-digit kills. Matt Skolnik (Costa Mesa, CA) and Kainoa Brede (Kaneohe, HI) were both strong in their defensive leadership, while Kaimana Kamalani and Poyer Poia (Honolulu, HI) were our steady ball control and strong outside attackers."





# Athletics at *Hope*

## 2005-2006 Women's Basketball Team Accomplishes Several Feats

Women's Basketball Head Coach, **T. J. Hardeman**, was named the 2005-2006 GSAC Coach of the Year. Hardeman, who is in his second season as head of the women's program, guided the Royals to their best showing since joining the Golden State Athletic Conference at the start of the 1999-2000 season. Coach Hardeman saw the Lady Royals to one of the most remarkable turnarounds in conference history.

Not long ago, the Royals finished at the bottom of arguably the toughest conference in the nation, posting an overall record of 6-27, 1-19 in the GSAC. This season, however, the Royals finished the regular season at 18-12, 10-10 in the GSAC. The Royals recorded several big wins in 2006, defeating three ranked teams in the process. *Hope* posted upset wins over Cal Baptist, Point Loma Nazarene, and its biggest win of the season, a double-overtime stunner against Azusa Pacific. The win over APU took place during the Royals' 7-game winning streak in early February.

*Hope's* 10 conference wins

this season nearly doubled the GSAC win total from the six previous seasons combined, and its 18 wins triples its win total from the 2004-2005 season. The Royals also finished the season in 6<sup>th</sup> place, landing a spot in the GSAC post-season tournament for the first time in school history.

The Royals competed in the NCCAA Postseason Tournament in Oakland City, IN in early March, defeating Emmanuel College (GA) to claim a third place finish. Junior Guard/Forward **Jasmine Nault**, a 5'9" guard from Anaheim, CA, was named to the 2006 NCCAA All-Tournament basketball team. She posted tournament averages of 21.3 points and 10 rebounds while shooting 45% (22-49) from the field and 80% (20-25) from the free throw line. She was also named an NCCAA 2<sup>nd</sup> team All-American. Nault was also named to the 2006 All-GSAC Women's Basketball team and was also selected as a GSAC Player of the Week during the month of February.

Senior forward **Carly Andrews** also garnered postseason honors, as she was selected as an NCCAA Honorable Mention All-American. Andrews posted tournament averages of 10.3 points, 6 rebounds, and 2 assists. Andrews shot 100% from the free line in three games (7-7) during the postseason tournament. Andrews also garnered GSAC Player of the Week honors during the month of February.

This was the first All-GSAC selection for *Hope's* Women's Basketball program, and the first Coach of the Year honor for the Royals program. The Lady Royals finished the season with a record of 20-14.

## Men's Tennis Team Breaks into NAIA Top 25

On March 29<sup>th</sup>, the Men's Tennis team entered a new level of competitive tennis. After big wins over Westmont, Vanguard, and Concordia, the Royals earned an NAIA national ranking. The Royals landed the 24<sup>th</sup> spot on the NAIA poll, reaching this milestone through teamwork and contributions from several different players. "Joey Nedelisky, Eric Rusaw, Tony McCright, and David Schreiner were solid members of this year's squad, ready to contribute on a moment's notice," said head coach Dave Radford.

Team captain Felix Haufe played against some of the best competition in the nation, finishing the regular season with a record of

7-15. Dan Djukic and Indra Mitra formed one of the premier doubles teams in the GSAC, while Rajko Mladenovic and Ignacio Guerrero were very impressive in both singles and doubles action. Djukic finished the season with a 15-7 record, while Mladenovic finished the season with a 19-2 record.

At the end of April, the Royals participated in the Ojai Tournament and played well. There were 64 entries in singles play, and Haufe reached the Elite 8 before succumbing to an ankle injury. Mladenovic also played well for the Royals, reaching the Final 16. Of the 32 entries in doubles play, the doubles teams of Djukic/Haufe and Mladenovic/Guerrero reached the Elite 8. "This is the first time in the history of the Ojai Tournament that a *Hope* athlete has won a match and the furthest that any Royals player has ever advanced in the tournament," said Coach Radford. "I am very pleased with how well we performed."

## New Coaching Staff for Royal's Softball

*Hope's* Women's Softball team welcomed a new coaching staff in 2006, head coach Mike Fitzgerald and assistant coach Steve Littlejohn. The Royals recorded their first win of the season with an 8-0 decision over Cabrini College in the Sun West Tournament. Their biggest win of the year came when the Royals defeated #25 Biola on the road, 7-3. One week later, the Royals posted another GSAC win, this time a 5-4 victory at host Vanguard University.

Kim Smith (La Mirada, CA), a junior utility player, and Lisa Teberg (Phoenix, AZ), a sophomore shortstop, led the Royals this season. Smith batted .347 and posted 17 RBIs, while Teberg batted .340, stole 11 bases, and hit three home runs. Danielle Marinacci (Yorba Linda, CA) also provided solid play for the Royals before suffering a thumb injury in April. She recorded 7 doubles, 18 hits, 14 RBIs, and 2 home runs before being sidelined for the remainder of the season. Handling pitching duties for the Royals were freshmen Amanda Mesa (Moreno Valley, CA) and Leanna Valenzuela (Casa Grande, AZ).

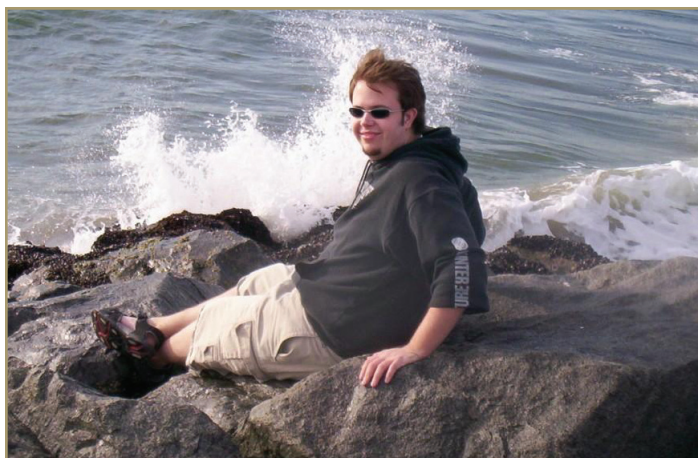

## The Living Trust

The Living Trust is the most popular way to pass your estate on to your heirs. Perhaps the biggest advantage of the Living Trust is that it does not go through probate, therefore, is less expensive to your estate and is often settled faster than one that goes through probate. In the Living Trust, you designate your beneficiaries and any ministries you want to support. You also receive what is known as a “Pour-over Will” which automatically places any assets not specifically titled into your Trust.

Another benefit is that the donor would receive an Income Tax Deduction. The amount of the deduction is based on a prescribed formula to determine the amount that is considered a gift and therefore tax deductible. It is about 50%, dependent upon age. In addition, the donor can avoid an immediate portion of Capital Gains when using appreciated assets to fund the annuity. If capital gains are to be paid over a period of time, this is included in your payment distribution. Finally, the donor can also enjoy the benefit of removable assets from his/her taxable estate. The amount you use to fund the annuity is generally excluded from your estate.

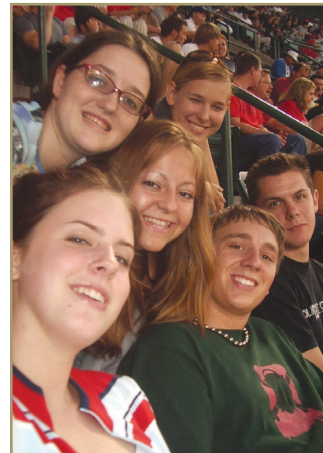

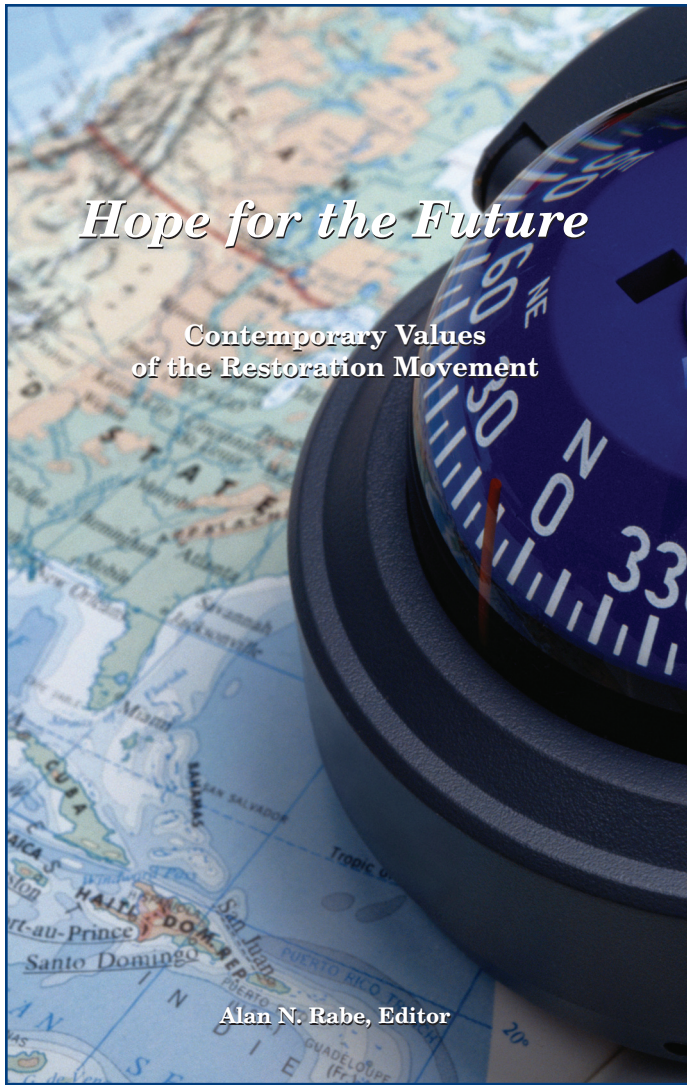
