Letter From the President



MUSIC AND MINISTRY

Music is an important part of our culture. It has become so integrated into many activities that we take it for granted and fail to think what life would be like if there were no background music to a movie or singing during a worship service. We have music for cell phone ring tones and music when we are put on hold for a phone call. We think nothing of seeing people connected to one of the more than 100 million iPods that have been sold allowing us to listen to our favorite classical, country, contemporary, or other style of music.

The Bible makes numerous references to the role of music in the life of God's people. Many of the Psalms were intended to be sung in worship and we are encouraged to "sing hymns, and spiritual songs" to build others up in Christ (Eph. 5:19). There is an interesting reaction when a story is told through the verses of a song, and we may even find ourselves moved to tears as we reflect on the message conveyed.

At Hope International University, we believe music is one of God's gifts to the world that can be used to minister to others and to bring glory to Him. Equipping men and women to use their gifts in this manner fits well with our mission to empower students to serve the church and impact the world for Christ. I had the privilege of joining them for a portion of this tour and was impressed by the gracious reception among the Christians there. The choir did an outstanding job of representing our university, our country, and our Lord. The music surpassed language and cultural differences and created a bond that can be established only by the Spirit of God.

I hope you will have an opportunity someday to be blessed by the ministry of our choir or one of our graduates.



Spirit of Hope Award Recipient 2007 Mr. Maurice F. Knott

Maurice Knott is the 2007 recipient of the "Spirit of Hope" Award. Knott has lived a full and varied life, actively serving God and country as a teacher, preacher, chaplain, entrepreneur, businessman, devoted husband, world traveler and author. A champion of Christian higher education, Knott has been a strong supporter of Hope International University having established the Knott Memorial Endowment in 2005 in honor of his parents.

Knott was commissioned as a Chaplain in the U.S. Army where he served for three years during WWII. He later served as a Chaplain in the Korean War, finally retiring from Active Reserve duty in 1973 with the rank of Lieutenant Colonel.



For several years in the late 1940's and early 1950's, Knott served as the pastor of Morningside Park Christian Church in Inglewood, California and as pastor at First Christian Church of Gardena, California. Many of Knott's writings have appeared in Disciple Renewal. He also taught as a professor at Pepperdine and in the California Community College system until becoming involved in the field of Real Estate Education, Brokerage and Investments.

The Celebrate Hope Dinner saw the kick off of The Hope Associates, the premier giving group to the University. "Hold On" to the Music

Insidehope recently sat down and talked with *Hope* alum Tyrone Wells (BA '98) between national tours and recording sessions to talk about his skyrocketing career in the music industry.

HIU - Tyrone, tell us what it was like growing up in Spokane.

TW- Well, Spokane seemed like a big city to me back then. I was the 'son of a preacher man' and had a positive upbringing, with parents who were walking what they were talking. And so I look back at those years as really great years. I love Washington, and Spokane, it was a great city.

HIU - When did you know you wanted to be a performer?

TW - When I was in junior high singing in choirs I had a good buddy named Brandon O'Neill, and he and I were writing some songs together. At the age of 12 or 13, I knew this might be the path I was headed down. And while I hoped I could make it a reality, I was planning on being a pastor. My father was a pastor, both my grandparents were pastors, even some uncles. So it was in the blood.

HIU - During that time, who was your biggest influence musically?

TW - Growing up, I used to listen to a lot of gospel, like Take 6. They were a cool group I really, really liked. Anything that had kind of a soulful feel. I would listen to groups like Commissioned. They were typically African-American, pretty much anything soulful and gospel is what I'd listen to.

HIU - You have performed at some pretty outstanding venues like the Roxy and House of Blues. What's it like to perform at these places?

TW - I know that I had set a goal to play at the House of Blues in LA and in Anaheim. And so when I was able to attain a goal that I set for myself, it was really a neat, almost `pinch yourself' moment. I thought to myself, Is this really happening? So yeah, it's been thrilling to set goals like that and see them happening. It's fantastic. I guess when you set a goal and it happens, it's kind of a landmark.

HIU - You feel like it was a long road to get there?

TW - Yeah, I do feel like it was a long road to get there. I think there are a lot of people who see an artist come on the national scene and think they were an overnight success, but typically you see an artist working on their craft for well over 10 years or more in some cases. There are certainly exceptions to that, but I think that's more of the rule. It takes a long time to grow to a certain point.

HIU - Your music been featured on numerous television shows including One Tree Hill, The Mountain, Rescue Me, The North Shore, and most recently on the NBC television show Age of Love. How has that affected your career?

TW - You know, I definitely think it's a financial shot in the arm for an artist to get their stuff placed on TV and in film. It's also been a way for me to calculate whether it's benefited me by how it actually brings bodies into a room when we go on tour. And in today's music marketplace, you can use any help you can get. It's been really neat because I've met a lot of people that tell me they've heard (my music) in the background on one of their favorite TV shows.

HIU - Tell us a little bit about what it's like to tour.

TW - Touring can be both a lot of fun and a real bummer. I'm newly married, two years, and ... my career... it's really starting to hit its stride. Right as I got married ... and with that comes more of a demand nationally, and the opportunities are there. And so for

me that's been a real balancing act, because obviously I know that God has given me this relationship. And it's really important to nurture it, but if I wanted to I could be on the road nonstop playing dates everywhere. And so, you know, we really struggled trying to find some time where we set aside to get away and just be with one another.

There are so many aspects to touring; obviously the accountability. Four out of five of the guys in our group

are believers, and we all talk about the obvious opportunity for peril on the road in doing the wrong thing and making sure we're accountable to each other and doing what God wants us to do. So



thank God for these guys, because we do have fellowship and accountability with each other. It puts my wife's mind at ease. It's also exciting to watch a national fan base starting to grow. It's exhilarating. Lots of fun.

HIU - Does your wife Erin get to go with you on the road?

TW - Sometimes she does go with me. She's a very gifted and talented person, and it's not her ideal situation to follow me around on the road all the time, or sit in the van for hours on end. She

does come with me from time to time, but she also needs to be at home, plugged into the community. That's the tough part about touring.

HIU - What was your favorite concert of the ones you've done?

TW - One that really sticks out I actually got called from the Attorney General's office in New York. My wife and I had written a song called Dream Like New York. Andrew Cuomo called Universal records, which is my label in New York, and they gave us a call. They had booked Michael McDonald to play at his inauguration and he'd gotten sick at the last minute. So we were asked to fill in for him. And so it was a real interesting, full circle experience for us to perform this song in a very different venue than what I'm used to with a bunch of politicians. New York has adopted the song and plays it in a variety of venues.

HIU - Is it tough being a Christian in this type of business?

TW - I think because I have a team of Christians around me, the people I work with day in and day out are believers. And that's really important to me. Of course I work with a lot of people who are not



believers from the label side of things. My label is Universal Republic. Definitely I'm working on the front lines where it's important that I do have my church community and my immediate circle of Christian influence. But also, one thing I think that's very encouraging is there are a lot of great Christian artists out there, like The Fray and Matt Kearny,

Switchfoot, Matt Wertz and the list really goes on and on. So there are artists out there that are really at the top of their game and getting noticed right now and they're believers.

HIU - Let's talk about Hope for a minute. What drew you to the University?

TW - Well, my family relocated, and I had two sisters that were attending *Hope* and loved it. So they encourage

me to check it out. And at that point I was working at T.J. Maxx. I think I was the head cashier. That was the year I got out of high school and had spent a year not going to college and thought I was going to be a youth minister. And so I came and checked it out. Of course, loved it and decided to start attending one year after high school. That's how I got here.

HIU - Tell us about your experiences at PCC.

TW - There were four guys who are my best friends from school and I met them there. I was in a band with them. Most people attending school back then couldn't have gotten away from us. We were always hanging flyers around town and playing shows. We were called Sky Park back then. We actually cut a

couple of records on Word's label. And those guys are probably always going to be my best friends with the exception of my wife. I loved the professors,





they were top-notch teachers. I learned a lot from them. My experience at *Hope* was really positive. I was involved with (the University touring vocalists) Ekklesia. I was a camp counselor, so I experienced a lot going to the camps. That was a great experience.

HIU - Did you ever get into trouble?

TW - (laughs) You know, it's kind of funny. I was really tame back then. I've got a guy in my band, the

drummer, who went to UCLA and boy he could tell stories for days. My experience wasn't anything like that. I think I had such a healthy respect for authority that I never wanted to walk outside the lines. And I certainly attribute that to my father in bringing me up the way he did. Although Ekklesia highly encouraged me to cut my hair (laughs) I did...and it was all gone!

HIU - How did going to PCC help with your career?

TW - That's a good question, and I'm not sure that I can completely pinpoint exactly what it was. I just know it did. PCC helped me to be a critical thinker. I think I learned the most when I got involved in a practicum as



part of a class. That was so valuable for me. It was the real world. I think in terms of music a lot of things helped me. I was able to apply the lessons I learned from

running a little band like Sky Park back then. Definitely applying faith to wherever you work.

HIU - What's next for Tyrone Wells?

TW - The cycle of an artist is really writing, recording and touring. Right now I'm trying to make space for writing. If you're really successful, sometimes you can take a year off. That's one thing I love about this job. You really set your own hours. My wife and I are taking two weeks off to go to Australia in the fall, as it's our anniversary time. I know that God is honored when I use the gift of music he gave me, but I know I must also be careful to guard my life with my wife and family... we're hoping to have kids down the line.

MUSIC AND WORSHIP ARTS

The Music and Worship Arts majors are some of the most exciting academic programs at Hope International University. These programs are offered at both the undergraduate and graduate levels and are designed to prepare those with an interest and talent in music to develop as effective worship leaders in the life of the Church. Current students and graduates of these programs are in high demand at churches across the country, and many have gone on to forge careers in music ministry and performance.

Pacific Christian College offers the Bachelor of Music degree that consists of courses that are both theoretical and practical. Students have ample opportunities for performance and worship leading both through *Hope's* chapel worship band and through involvement with local churches. HIU also presents an annual musical that is open to the public, as well as numerous concerts, orchestras, and ensemble performances throughout the year.

The School of Graduate Studies offers both the Master of Arts in Worship, and also the Master of Church Music (MCM). The Master of Arts is for worship leaders in congregations of all sizes and integrates theological studies with the very practical elements of effective worship leadership. It gives attention to the arts (drama, dance, visual arts) in addition to the usual elements (vocal, instrumental, technical production, etc).

The Master of Church Music is taught entirely in the Korean language, and HIU the only regionally accredited university in the United States to offer such a program. This degree program is designed to equip Korean-speaking church music ministers with a high degree of professional music skills for ministry.

HERE'S AN UPDATE ON A FEW OF OUR GRADUATES



David Morgan (BA, '81) is the Worship Pastor at Overlake Christian Church in Redmond, WA. He has been the worship leader for Promise Keepers on three occasions, and led music in the United States and overseas with evangelist Mike Silva. David received in 2005 the "Northwest

Most Distinguished Musician Award" by the NW Christian Artists Association. In 2001, the Mayor of Redmond, proclaimed September 9, "Dave Morgan Day" in honor of his twenty years service with the Overlake Christian Church. "I was hired by Overlake Christian Church right out of college and have served there for the last 26 years. My role as the Worship Pastor has included weekly planning and leading worship, directing choirs and ensembles, producing annual musical performances, producing several recording projects, serving on the senior leadership team of the church, and occasionally teaching for weekend services. In addition to working full time at the church, I have had the privilege of leading worship for camps, conferences, and crusades around the country as well as overseas." In reflecting on his time at *Hope*, David notes that he benefited from the help of many professors, particularly Cora Alley, Alger Fitch and John Rowe. "These three stand out, not only as excellent teachers, but as mentors, encouragers and life long friends."



Jesse Peterson (BA '04) is the Director of Worship Arts at Adventure Christian Church in Roseville, CA. Following graduation, Peterson moved to Roseville, joined the church and a few days later married his college sweetheart, Joanna. He began at Adventure as an intern in

the Young Adult Ministry. Within a year, he joined the staff as an associate minister, and then in 2006 he accepted his current position. "There is so much rich history in the classic hymns and so many beautiful anthems of today. Since I believe that worship is a lifestyle and not a style of music...it allows me to choose any kind or type of music that I feel would best fit the community in which God has placed me. It's not about being new or fresh with our music today...it's about being relevant and sincere."

Peterson continues to play music at local coffee houses and enjoys karaoke. He is in the process of writing a book entitled, "Misadventures of a Young Worship Leader" which is a faith memoir that talks about some of the lessons that he has learned as a young leader in today's church.

"Hope provided me with so many priceless opportunities to grow as a musician and as a leader. As a freshman and sophomore, I traveled and sang with Ekklesia. As a junior, I traveled to camps, churches, punk rock shows and so many more places with Troubadours Home. As a senior, I was placed in an internship where I was allowed to lead and plan church services. The experience I received from the university is immeasurable."

Jesse also comments, "I remember going through some of the toughest times in my life without my family...money...and other security blankets. Yet, I never felt alone...there was always someone who came along side me or that I could talk to in the midst of refining my character and love for the Lord...In college, I learned to fall in love with my Savior. I began to understand what His call was for my life and I was equipped to use the gifts that God has given me."



Yeon-Hee Ju (MCM, '06) completed her internship at the Sa-Rang Community Church in Anaheim, CA under the direction of Dr. Joseph Cho while she was still a student at HIU. Upon graduation, Ju was hired as the Music Director at Mokpo Sa-Rang Community Church in Korea where

she now oversees two choirs, 3 worship teams, the Korean traditional music team, Koom male choir and one women's choir. She also teaches music at the public middle school, where she was named "Excellent Teacher" in her region by the education department. Ju credits her experiences as a Conducting Major in the MCM program with providing her the tools to her current success. "As the president of the MCM students, I started the first annual MCM concert which hosted many church choirs directed by our students," says Ju. "When all the choirs who participated... sang together as a unified choir, that was one of my great memories."



Kim Lullo (BA '87) is the Worship Director for the Mission Viejo Christian Church in California. "I began two years ago as the Creative Arts Director and have moved up to Worship Director about 8 months ago. That includes Sunday worship music, but also drama, art and décor,

technical, dance, choirs, special events, etc." Lullo also leads worship occasionally at Angeles Christian Camp, women's retreats and conferences.

Since her college days, Lullo has been actively involved in the music ministry of several local churches, area Christian schools and on the HIU campus. She has taught Music at Eastside Christian School and Mission Viejo Christian School, and has served as the worship leader for Knott Avenue Christian Church, Valley Vista Christian Church, and Creekside Christian Fellowship, all in Southern California. Combining her giftedness as a pianist and vocalist with her organizational strengths, Lullo served as Director for the university music group Ekklesia during the years 1988-1992. "We traveled throughout the US, Mexico and Canada, sang at the NACC every year, and performed on the 'To You With Love' television program in Calgary." The group also produced two recording projects during that time.

In reflecting on her time at Hope and memorable experiences, she notes that she loved living in the dorms and developing relationships with wonderful roommates, enjoyed choir tours and all music experiences, and her internship at EV Free in Fullerton, when Chuck Swindoll was the Senior Pastor. She notes that faculty members Knofel Staton and Paul McReynolds impacted her life by teaching her how to study scripture. "I am thankful I got to learn about flexibility in ministry - from style of worship to working with difficult people, to loving and ministering to people where God plants you. Hope gave me many opportunities to use my gifts. Hope gave me the tools to improve, the passion for more of God's Word, and the confidence to get out there and do it."

Music at HIU

CHOIR TOUR TO SOUTH KOREA



n the history of the Music Department at Hope International University, there have been many choirs and ensembles, most of which "hit the road" with their songs at one point or another. Students have traveled in these groups to most of the fifty United States, visiting numerous churches, colleges, camps and conventions with a mission to represent the University while spreading the good news of Christ's love and grace. Dr. Joseph Cho, current Chairman of the Music Department, has had a vision for Hope students to extend their impact to an international level and expressed his desire for "those who are in a Christian environment all the time to be challenged, and to experience (God) in a different way - spiritually, financially, emotionally." Dr. Cho was inspired not only by his desire for American students to experience the culture of his homeland, but also his desire to see Christians from opposite ends of the globe come together in fellowship and share their hope in Christ. This past spring, Dr. Cho's vision became a reality, and the Hope International University Chorale took its first tour overseas to South Korea.

Over the course of 11 days, the Chorale consisting of 24 undergraduate students, 6 graduate students and 4 staff visited 7 churches and 3 universities and stayed with Korean host families for the majority of the time. The home-stay experience was one of the highlights of the trip for *Hope* students. HIU junior Kayla McGill explained, "The thing I liked most about our trip to Korea was being

immersed in the culture by living in home-stays most of the time. The family that I lived with was amazing. They were so welcoming and hospitable." Every member of the group was struck by the generosity of the host families and how they reached out to make the group feel comfortable and welcome, despite the cultural differences and language barriers.

In addition to the English language songs performed, the Chorale had specifically rehearsed two songs in Korean: "You Are Born to be Loved," and "Psalm 23." Each hosting church made the Chorale feel like very special guests. Staff member Wende Holtzen observed, "I saw God working in the churches through the people who prepared for our arrival by choosing menus and fixing the most amazing dinners for us. We were all so touched by the hours the people had put into preparing the food for us." The faith and heartfelt worship demonstrated was an inspiration to the Hope students and staff. Professor Rick Terry was touched by "the people - thousands of people who have committed themselves to love and become like Christ in so many ways..." HIU senior Caroline Spingath added, "I was so inspired by the way people in the church lived out their faith, and was immensely blessed by the way they prayed and provided for us. Since then it has challenged me to be more genuine in my walk with Christ, so that I too can live, pray and love others passionately."

WOMEN'S SOCCER TEAM MAKES NATIONALS

The Hope Women's Soccer team finished 5th at the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA) National Tournament in Kissimmee, Florida. The Royals, the NCCAA West Region winners, lost 1-0 to Trinity Christian, beat Dallas Baptist 1-0, and defeated Olivet Nazarene 2-1. They finished the season with an 11-8-2 overall record and 3-6-1 in the Golden State Athletic Conference (GSAC). The eleven overall wins and three conference wins set school records for the Women's Soccer program.

ALL-GSAC PERFORMERS

A trio of *Hope* athletes were named at the end of October to their respective All-GSAC teams. Men's Soccer player Jose Andrade, a Sophomore from Sylmar, CA, lead the team with 8 goals scored. Women's Soccer

player Harmony Pruett, a Freshman from Apple Valley, CA, used her speed to score a team high 10 goals. Leslie White, a defender from Corona, CA, was a major reason the Women's Soccer team recorded 7 shutouts on the year. She also

Last spring, Lisa Teberg, the now senior from Phoenix, AZ, was named to her second career All-GSAC Women's Softball team. She finished tied for fifth in the GSAC with 8 homeruns. She also finished in the league's



During the ceremony, Walling was presented with an honorary Doctor of Divinity degree from *Hope*.

UPCOMING **SPEAKERS**

ormer State Assembly woman and current Director of the California Department of Aging,
Lynn Daucher is scheduled to be the keynote speaker for the Fall 2007 Commencement ceremony. The event will be held in the Darling Pavilion on Saturday, December 15.

Daucher was appointed Director of the California Department of Aging by Governor Arnold Schwarzenegger in February 2007. Prior to this, she served as State Assembly woman for the 72nd District, of which Fullerton is included. She was first elected to the Assembly in 2000 after serving for six years on the Brea City Council, including one year as Mayor.



A teacher by profession, Daucher began her public service when she was elected to the

MEDFORD JONES SERVANT LEADER AWARD

r. Medford Jones (1919-2004) served as HIU's president between the years 1969 and 1981. Even after retiring from the presidency, he continued to teach in the School of Graduate Studies until shortly before his death at the age of 85. As a tribute to his life of service and leadership, the Medford Jones Servant Leader Award was established in 2005. The award is presented annually during the Spring Commencement banquet and recognizes one graduating student from each school who has best exemplified the personal qualities of Christian service and outstanding leadership ability. Josh Bollen graduated Magna Cum Laude from Pacific Christian College with a Bachelor of Music and Worship Arts degree. A very gifted musician, Bollen combines academic excellence, outstanding musical talent

and a heart for worship. During his time as a PCC student he served with excellence within the worship ministries of local churches.

Deric Unoura graduated Cum Laude from the School of Professional Studies where he earned his Bachelor of Science in Management. Nearly ten years earlier, Unoura had suffered a major back injury accompanied by a



massive stroke, wiping out much of his memory and his ability to read and comprehend. During the years of rehabilitation, Unoura's embarked on Simon's Net Fishing Ministry, an outreach that arranges low-cost chartered fishing expeditions in Southern California. The ministry makes a special effort to reach out to underprivileged, physically disabled, and single-parent children by recruiting "Fisher Friends" who sponsor the children, build positive relationships, and demonstrate the love of Christ.



Chuck Mihlbauer graduated from the School of Graduate Studies with an MBA in Nonprofit Management. While completing his Masters degree, Mihlbauer was also working full-time as a Senior Executive Account Manager

with the pharmaceutical company, GlaxoSmithKline, serving in the critical and supportive care division.

KNOFEL STATON CHRISTIAN COMMUNICATION AWARD



r. Knofel Staton served the University as president from 1981-1990 and remains an effective communicator of biblical truths through both the written and the spoken word. Staton remained a favorite professor among PCC students until his retirement in 2006. The **Knofel Staton Christian Communication Award** was established in 2006 and is presented annually in the spring to a graduating student who best exemplifies the gift of communication as exhibited by Dr. Staton.

The first recipient of the award is **Dan Shields**. A 2007 graduate of the School of Graduate Studies, Shields first graduated from Pacific Christian College in 1998 with a degree in Youth Ministry. Shields used his gifts of preaching and teaching to start an innovative and successful urban youth ministry while he was still an undergraduate student at PCC, and eventually moved on to join the staff at Adventure Christian Church in Roseville, California. It was at Adventure that Shields helped to grow their young adult ministry to over 400 people. Shields is now involved in a church plant in Gilbert, Arizona.

STUDENT SERVANT LEADERS IN COMPTON



Hope students did an "Extreme Church Makeover" in the spring as they gave their labor of love to the First Christian Church of Compton, California.

Compton as a community is home to more than 60 recognized gangs with an average of one murder per day. The church has served as a beacon of hope in the midst of this community that is so plagued by violence. Dr. Joe Grana is among the *Hope* faculty who teach classes there for leaders and ministers. Upon noticing the needs of the church building, Grana challenged the HIU student body for assistance and dug into his own pocket for seed money.

The ASB responded by raising over

\$2,000 and recruiting more than 100 students who spent six Saturdays renovating the church. *Hope* students moved furniture, cleaned rooms, organized books in the library, rebuilt a sound booth and painted classrooms, offices and the library to give a much-needed facelift to the facility, including the chapel of the Christian school that is operated by the church. Because of their efforts, the school was able to open on time with a fresh new look. Students commented that being part of providing the school children a better environment to learn was both humbling and rewarding.



STUDENT SERVANT LEADERS

ore than 20 years ago, alumni Gayla (MA '89) and husband Scott Congdon (MA '89) began a ministry of building houses for the poor in Mexico through AMOR Ministries. Since its inception, HIU students have been participating in this ministry by helping to build houses, or serving as counselors to other groups from around the country who come for shortterm building projects during Spring Break. Some have

commented, "I was able to be part of something bigger than myself and become the hands and feet of Christ. Seeing the look on the family's face was rewarding, and it allowed me to see the love of God through that family in a tangible way."

Students are doing the same this fall as they seek to build two more houses for the poorest of the poor across Mexico's border.
