HIU is committed to the educational effectiveness of its program. Courses are regularly assessed according to the Program Learning Objectives for each degree. The following represent an average for the last five years for the Master of Arts in Ministry degree. In addition, in 2018-2019, the university began distinct assessment of the Master of Arts and Master of Divinity degree, which is also found below

- 3) SPIRITUAL AND PERSONAL FORMATION - Students will demonstrate both spiritual and personal maturity through an increasing awareness of the presence of Christ and conformity to the character of Christ with a perspective of the priesthood of all believers.
- 4) SKILLS FOR MINISTRY - Students will demonstrate effective and practical ministry skills in their concentration.
