### Calculations for Measures

MEASURE	DESCRIPTION AND HOW IT WAS CALCULATED
Retention	One-year retention rates were calculated by following a group of entering students in a given fiscal year (FY) and seeing who was still active at the start of the next FY. Percentages based on small numbers of students may explain the variation over time.
Graduation	Graduation rates are calculated by taking the number of students who graduated divided by the total number of students who started in that FY. Time to completion is calculated using 150% of the standard graduation time. Therefore, it is six years for bachelor-seeking students and three years for master-degree-seeking students. The most recent graduation rate we can provide is FY19 for bachelor students and FY22 for master students.
