DEPRESSION & MINISTRY

ADDRESSING A SILENT EPIDEMIC

HIU's new President, **Dr. Paul Alexander**, has created a powerful, poignant workshop and video series for pastoral staff entitled "Depression & Ministry." The need to develop a curriculum and presentation for this topic had been on Dr. Alexander's heart, and he was compelled to action after the tragic suicide of a prominent local pastor last fall, thus creating this free resource for pastors and their ministry staff.

"The goal of this workshop and video series is to encourage pastors and give pastoral staff a voice to admit when help is needed," says Dr. Alexander. "We want to take away from the stigma that surrounds mental health, especially in pastoral careers. Because



6% of our population is dealing with depression, we also want to ensure that senior ministry staff understand what some of their church members may be going through."

"We're here to offer a safe space to bring awareness to this topic, as well as offer permission for pastoral staff to discuss any issues they may be having," states **Dr. Joe Grana**, Dean of HIU's College of Pacific Christian College of Ministry & Biblical Studies.

"There's never been a more important time for churches to address the subject of mental health and depression, and there is no one I know more capable of speaking to the subject matter than Dr. Paul Alexander of Hope International University," says **Gene Appel**, Senior Pastor at Eastside Christian Church. "He has spoken to our staff and many of our parents. Everyone has found his presentation tremendously informative and helpful." Dr. Alexander is a Licensed Marriage & Family Therapist and an Ordained Pastor in the Christian Churches/Church of Christ.

Currently, there is very little information regarding depression among professional clergy. Anonymous interaction during the presentation using Wooclap software will help collect data for furthering research studies on this enormously important issue.

MINISTERING TO MINISTERS

During the past 45 years of marriage and ministry, **Lee** (BS '72, MA '78) and **Loralee** (BS '72) **McClanathan** have experienced the good, the bad and the ugly of pastoral life. This includes depression, bitterness, burnout, health crises, and other challenges that are all too common for vocational ministers.

Over the course of his career in ministry, Lee has pastored growing churches in IL, CA & AR, helping people become devoted followers of Jesus Christ. Though Lee had retired, he is now back on staff at Northeast Christian Church in Rockford, IL, as a liaison for pastoral care and encouragement. He was formerly the church's lead pastor for 11 years.

Recently, Lee was invited to join Standing Stone Ministry to provide care for pastors and ministry leaders, their spouses, and families. "My vision and desire is to help reduce the number of pastors who leave the ministry because of depression and burnout."

Pastor Lee says, "I can't think of a better way to bring my ministry days to an end, than to invest my life in



pastors and ministry leaders through Standing Stone. After much prayer I'm convinced that I have been called to this vital ministry."

After battling stage four lung cancer in 2017, Loralee is now cancer free and continues to mentor their two grown children and five grandchildren.



As **Dr. Wes Beavis** (MFT'12) began working toward his Marriage and Family Therapy degree, he studied issues that motivate people to seek therapy. Having served in church ministry for more than 20 years, Beavis knew firsthand that Christian ministers are not immune to those same issues.

"Pastors often feel like they should know all the answers and be 'good examples.' If pastors are struggling in their own lives, they can feel a sense of shame or guilt. As a consequence, many church ministry leaders suffer in silence. As a pastor, I know I did," Beavis shares. "I struggled with many of the symptoms of ministry burnout."

His personal journey inspired Dr. Beavis to further research this important issue. He discovered that when ministers are suffering burnout, they tend to isolate themselves. They just don't want to be around people... which is a very real problem in the role of a pastor.

"One of the essential tips for the wellbeing of pastors is for them to recognize that isolation is an indicator that they are on a burnout trajectory. It is essential for pastors to talk to someone, but not just anyone," says Beavis. "Often burnout is the result of personal issues that have not been dealt with in a healthy way. A trained clinician can help a pastor effectively identify the root cause and reverse the burnout process." "I firmly believe that we cannot adequately address the reality of pastoral mental health if we don't talk about it," he states emphatically.

Dr. Beavis recently published his findings in his book, *Let's Talk About Ministry Burnout*. He currently shares practical advice for ministry leaders in his private practice and via seminars called "Leading with Wellbeing," during which he presents his research on the six stages of ministry burnout with church and ministry leaders.

"Many of the skills that I employ in my clinical practice, I received from my training at HIU," Bevis says. "At every step of my journey, HIU staff and faculty supported me in the development of my specialization."

Wes and his wife, Ellie, each have private MFT practices in Newport Beach, California. They have raised two sons, David and Zack.

For Every Deaf Person

HEARING THE CALL TO DEAF MINISTRY

Duane (56) & Peggy King met when she was a sophomore in high school, and a "tall, handsome preacher from Nebraska Christian College" began a weekend ministry at her church. He left the church to travel with The Watchmen Quartet during her senior year in high school and, when he returned for a visit at Christmas, they had their first date. Peggy also decided to attend NCC and they married in 1961, after Duane became pastor of First Christian Church in Norfolk, NE. A few years later, they had two children, Christine ('85), who is now an HIU trustee, and J.D. ('90), who founded Deaf Child Hope International.

Neither of the Kings, founders of Deaf Missions, expected to become ministers with the deaf. Duane was happy in pastoral ministry, and Peggy, who had originally planned to be a kindergarten teacher, was very happy as a pastor's wife. They both expressed gratitude for their experiences at NCC, which contributed significantly to their openness to following God's unexpected call.

"NCC didn't prepare me to work with deaf people," said Duane. "NCC prepared me to work with all people."

Peggy said she learned how to teach children at NCC, which has served her well as a pastor's wife and in her work with Deaf Missions. "I learned how to give of oneself and follow the Lord – it inspired me for ministry," she recalled.

Their ministry was born when Duane met a deaf couple while delivering an anonymous cash gift to the tenants of one of his congregants. The husband and wife communicated to Duane that they didn't attend church because they couldn't really understand much of the service, so Duane started a service for the deaf on Sunday afternoons and learned sign language on the job, thus initiating the King family's lifelong ministry to deaf people.

The Central Church of Christ in Griswold, Iowa, invited King to serve as Pastor in 1968 and encouraged Duane and Peggy to minister at the nearby Iowa School for the Deaf. Later, the couple also taught at the Nebraska School for the Deaf, and their ministry blossomed, leading to Duane's decision to minister to the deaf on a fulltime basis. The Griswold church paid Duane's salary, while the Kings raised money to start Deaf Missions, whose first home was located in the finished basement of the King's house.

Peggy studied sign language formally, and began to sense the same strong calling that Duane did. Christ's Church for the Deaf was founded at the First Christian Church of Council Bluffs and Deaf Missions grew quickly and bought property adjoining the King's house, where the ministry is still based.

"We have learned so much," said Duane. "Deaf people rely so much on their eyesight that they want everything to be tangible – they want to be able to see everything. This sometimes makes it harder for them to grasp intangibles like salvation through faith."

A significant element of the Kings' calling is to meet the need for an ASL Bible, and they expect to have one completed next year. The Kings said that there are 70 million deaf people in the world and 400 sign languages, but there have never been complete Bibles translated into sign language. The American Sign Language (ASL) version of the Bible is a video recording of a skilled ASL interpreter, signing the Bible. It is much more effective with deaf people who are not skilled with English - which is the case with the majority of deaf people - than a printed Bible.

"Deaf people average a 4th grade reading level in English," said Duane, "but their understanding of sign language is at a 12th grade level – most hearing people don't understand how difficult it is to learn to read when you cannot hear."

MODERN DAY MIRACLE

While the King family has experienced miracles in their ministry over the course of many decades, perhaps the most stunning miracle in their lives occurred when Peggy experienced a traumatic health crisis.

Peggy began to develop a different personality in early 2010, and her unwanted new life included panic attacks, severe pain, anger, and aggression. Her behavior included shoplifting, disappearing from home, lying, lethargy, and loss of her ability to play the piano. She was finally diagnosed with Frontal Temporal Dementia (FTD), and the doctors believed her condition would deteriorate for the remainder of her life, which they hoped would be mercifully short.

Duane and Peggy moved into a retirement village that included care for those suffering from dementia, and Peggy was soon moved into a Memory Unit, which the devastated family believed would be permanent. She adjusted, made friends, joined the choir and a Bible study group and began to improve a little, but Duane was still overwhelmed. He said he finally told God that he didn't like it, but that he would accept it.

"I said, 'Now, will you please help me through it and be glorified in the process'?" Duane remembered.

Peggy then began to improve noticeably, even though she was taking no medication. Prior to a January 2011 visit with the doctor, Peggy sent the doctor a letter, explaining what had been happening, including a vacation with Duane over the holidays that included such ordinary, wonderful activities as cooking meals (during the worst of her illness, she couldn't follow a recipe).

The very surprised doctor said that she had never seen a patient recover from FTD, and while she couldn't present it to a scientific audience, it was evident that prayers had been answered. She told Peggy that she would be able to move back in with Duane and resume her life, and later called her recovery a "modern day miracle."



The Kings may never know in this life, why they endured - and triumphed over - this experience, but they have several theories. God may have wanted to teach them more about faith or the power of prayer. Perhaps He wanted them to know how many people care for them, or how strong their family is. Probably the most intriguing theory is this: Duane had said for years that Deaf Missions should start a mini-Bible college for the deaf, but there was no space for it. When Duane and Peggy moved out of their home and into the retirement village, the space was redesigned to house students, and nearby space was converted into classrooms. Peggy said that they would probably still be in that house, if not for her illness.

"No one but God knows what our remaining days will hold," Peggy wrote in *I Believe in Miracles*, a book she wrote with Duane about their healing experience. "He says, 'Trust Me – haven't I always been faithful?' and I answer, 'Yes, Lord, you have never failed me."

Duane and Peggy continue to serve, travel, and speak.



When PETE CONTRERAS ('88) and his wife, JULIE ('90) felt the call to urban ministry, there was no such term as "urban ministry." But New Vision Christian Fellowship, which they launched in 2008, has become a remarkably effective ministry to San Diego's most at-risk communities.

URBAN "INREACH" CULTIVATING UNITY IN DIVERSITY THROUGH FAITH & CREATIVITY

Pete Contreras ('88) grew up in East Los Angeles, part of a Catholic family that went to church only on holidays. His parents were divorced when he was very young and he lived with his mother until a violent tragedy took the lives of his mother and younger brother. He then lived with his father in a community where gang activity was considered normal, but said that sports kept him out of gangs. He joined the high school varsity football team as a freshman, and served as team captain.

He first heard the gospel during the summer following high school graduation, when his friend invited him to church camp. Laughing, he admitted that he only accepted the invitation because he knew there would be girls at camp. While he was there, Pete reflects, "God 'found' me."

"I went out into the woods one day, and told God he had 30 days to prove he was real," he recalled. "That was my 'sinner's prayer," and when I got back home, I stopped drinking and using drugs and started reading the Bible. I really knew nothing about God!"

Contreras played football his freshman year at Whittier College, and found a Calvary Chapel in Los Angeles where he could learn, but said that he needed to learn more. The same friend who invited him to camp told him about Hope International University (then PCC), and he soon transferred.

Early in his college years, Pete realized that his calling was working with the poor in cities, and he lived and worked in a housing project in North Long Beach while going to school. He has deep appreciation for faculty members, including **Drs. Joe Grana** and **Paul McReynolds**, who helped guide his growth and learning, as well as for friends who shared the vision of serving the poor, including **Gayla Congdon** (BA'77, MA'89), co-founder of Amor Ministries. "I knew that I was headed for ministry in an urban environment," he remembered, "and that foundation was laid at HIU through the strong biblical education and missions/ outreach experiences."

Pete and **Julie** (Hedlund '90) married in 1989 and planted Community Christian Church in San Diego, where they ministered for seven years, the last three with Pete as Senior Pastor. They served the urban community in several capacities before launching New Vision Christian Fellowship in 2008 from their home. A grand total of 15 people attended their first service.



The tiny "congregation" grew fairly quickly, and Julie told Pete that she believed God would give them a building for free. That vision became reality when they began to rent space from a local Baptist church, which later evolved into a merger.

After several years, the building needed maintenance, the congregation was outgrowing the space, and Contreras felt that God wanted the church to diversify its efforts. As church leaders fasted and prayed, residential growth in the neighborhood prompted the City of San Diego to re-zone the property to allow for more housing, and the property was suddenly in high demand. A developer bought the property for \$35 million, and rented the space back to the church for just \$100/year while the church searched for new property.

New Vision has grown into a remarkable multi-ethnic, multi-generational, multieconomic church, with an average attendance of 350, and is now a hub for more than 30 different ministries at multiple sites in San Diego's most at-risk communities. Those ministries include Hope House homeless teen shelter; youth ministries, children's ministries, a boxing ministry, education ministries in public schools, and Christian Urban Theatre (C.U.T.). The church has also planted 30 churches in Ethiopia.

"The gospel is integrated into all of our programs, including those for homeless, youth, seniors, education and counseling," said Contreras. "New Vision serves the community holistically, addressing the spiritual, physical, and emotional needs of people – body, soul, and spirit."

This fall, the church will launch New Vision Urban Impact, a vocational training school, through its Community Development Association. The church plans to start a for-profit entity next Fall to benefit nonprofit organizations, promoting economic development in urban areas.

Contreras and his congregation find great joy in the services they provide, seeing people thrive as God moves in real ways.

"I am excited about our church as a visual aid," he said. "The world is so divided, but this vastly diverse church is unified."

Pete challenges suburban churches to be prepared for urban ministry. As cities and communities change, what was once suburban becomes urban, so whether they are ready or not, "it's coming!"

Derry, guests enjoyed the musical performance of songwriter and recording artist Tyrone Wells (BA '98), who over his career has had over 60 million Spotify streams, 55,000 albums sold independently, and has had songs featured on American Idol, Grey's Anatomy, and One Tree Hill. Student speaker, Alexio Gomes (BA'19) shared of his personal testimony of how God has lead him and a group of his peers to start a grassroots outreach – which they call Messy Church ministering weekly at a local homeless encampment. PRESIDENTS STATON, DERRY, & LAWSON

TRANSITIONS: DR. JOHN DERRY

Having recently retired from his post as HIU's sixth President, **Dr. John Derry** has been named President Emeritus by the Hope International University Board of Trustees. Dr. Derry firmly believes that God uses our past to prepare us for the next place of service, and that will prove true in his retirement years as well.

"People often ask me, 'What will you do in retirement – got any hobbies?," Derry states. "I'm moving to a country club community with golf courses, lakes, and pickleball," he laughs, "but my hobby will probably be service of some kind."

Derry's answer surprises no one who has watched him lead Hope

International University for the past 16 years. His position at HIU represents the longest leg of his career, but each segment of his professional journey has shared a common theme.

"Everywhere God has led me has been a turn-around situation," he reflects. "The Hope community was open to change and willing to sacrifice because of their dedication to the mission."

Along the way, there have been far more changes in higher education including Christian higher education — than he could have possibly imagined, some of which have led to his greatest accomplishments. Dr. Derry came into an institution that was struggling financially, and implemented a five-year turnaround strategy that included a list of 120 items he wanted to address for growth. The primary goal of the strategy was to build consistency into the culture and environment. Not long after the campus began working on the plan, the Great Recession hit, and hit hard. Derry notes that the higher education community continues to reel from the impact of those difficult years.

At one juncture, HIU's Board and Administration had been considering possible relocation opportunities, including sites in Brea, Corona, Temecula, and Tustin. Part of then-

President Derry's strategy was to plan on parallel tracks: what would happen if the campus stayed in Fullerton, and what would happen if the campus relocated?

Building new student housing on campus was cost prohibitive, but a partnership with a student housing corporation changed the landscape of the existing campus, both literally and figuratively. The southeast corner of the campus is now adjacent to a mixed-use development that enhances available housing opportunities for HIU students and improves the aesthetic of the campus.

"It took a long time," Derry recalls. "God closed some other doors, but that project became the catalyst for staying in Fullerton."

He believes this is an exciting time in higher education, and says it's a vastly different world than when he entered college. Little did he know that he would spend more than fifty years in the higher education arena.

"There has never been a time when so many schools were closing," he says. "And six presidents of higher education institutions in Southern California are retiring shortly, which represents a major change."

Derry has contemplated, studied, and championed the idea that colleges and universities must learn to collaborate and consolidate, or "we will be victims of our own narrowminded competition." He has dreamed of a unified system of Christian colleges and universities, and says that in the past several years, six different schools have approached HIU regarding possible mergers, and each opportunity was carefully considered. Nebraska Christian College met the criteria and merged with HIU in 2016.

That historic agreement is one of the most significant milestones of Dr. Derry's legacy, and could become the foundation of a unified system. He is excited about what will happen on the Nebraska campus, located just outside Omaha, in Papillion.

Derry highly values the consistency of his President's Cabinet, which worked closely with him for nearly a decade, and is very pleased that Dr. Paul Alexander, formerly Vice President for Academic Affairs, has become HIU's new President

"Surround yourself with the right leadership, enjoy them, and pray with them," he advised President Alexander. "Financial and enrollment challenges will always be present, but commit to the long-term plan."

Dr. Derry also expressed his deep appreciation for members of HIU's Board of Trustees, past and present.

"They have a vision for the future," he comments, "and I am humbled by the honor of serving with them."

Dr. Derry is eager to see what God has planned for him in retirement, which he suspects will include consulting work in the areas of non-profit leadership and higher education with organizations such as the Western Association of Schools and Colleges, the Center for Church Leadership, and the Association for Biblical Higher Education, among others.


He treasures his increased availability to spend more time with his grandchildren, who range in age from second grade to college-aged, and expresses deep gratitude and love for his wife, Jane.

"She has partnered with and supported me faithfully wherever I've been called to serve," Derry says, "often sacrificing being close to our kids and grandkids."

"God directs our steps," Dr. Derry says, "and we see only in retrospect how He was fitting the pieces together all along the way."

NCC COMMENCEMENT HONOR WHERE HONOR IS DUE

This new award was established by the NCC faculty in honor of one of the most significant families in the history of the college. The Millikens have produced two former presidents as well as several faculty members, students, alumni, donors, and friends.

FROM HERE...TO ETERNITY CLASS OF 2019 SETS HISTORIC MARK

Last Spring, Hope International University held its **107th Commencement Ceremony**, proudly conferring degrees on the largest graduating class in HIU's 90-year history. The class of 2019 includes 407 undergraduate and graduate degrees (combined), 31 Hispanic Ministry Certificates, and 102 ESL Diplomas. In all, 540 students successfully completed their chosen courses of study. Drawn from a global student body of nearly 4,000 students representing 42 states and 16 countries, these graduates now join more than 14,000 alumni who carry HIU's legacy of exceptional servant leadership to locations around the globe.



In addition to his faculty position at HIU, DR. JOSEPH CHO directs the Korean American Elders Choir with members from 60 Los Angeles churches, and is the Music Pastor of Sa-Rang Community Church in Los Angeles, the largest Korean church outside of Korea.

He is also Musical Director for the Aioneo Christian orchestra, which consists of professional Christian musicians around the Orange County area.

FACULTY SPOTLIGHT

Dr. Joseph Sung Hwan Cho was born in Korea to a Buddhist family, and never even heard the name of Jesus. His exceptional vocal talent as a boy soprano set him on course for a global education at the age of nine when he was invited to join the World Vision Children's Choir. While traveling in the choir, he appeared on the CBS show, "One to One" with Julie Andrews.

From fifth grade through middle school, as part of the touring choir, he experienced twice-daily prayer with the group. It wasn't until later, when he encountered the Youth With a Mission (YWAM) organization, that he made his own profession of faith.

The generosity of an American Christian sponsor enabled Cho to come to the United States, where he earned his Master's degree from UCLA, followed by a Doctor of Music Arts degree at USC. While he was working on his doctorate and living in East Los Angeles, a Pacific Christian College student who was struggling with music theory was referred to Cho's wife, Sung-Wan, a respected musician and educator. The student asked Dr. Cho to give her private voice lessons. When her PCC instructors noticed her improved vocal performance, they learned about her new teacher, which led Cho to a part-time instructor position. He became a full-time faculty member a year later, in 1995.

Cho thanks God for giving him opportunities to learn new ways of teaching. Sometimes, just teaching someone how to sing is not sufficient to maximize the education experience, as he found when one of his first students seemed to be blocked by something every time he sang. One day, Cho stopped the student's lesson and asked him to talk; as the student shared his life story, the teacher began to see what was behind the student's inability to perform.

"Every lesson after that was different," he remembered. "Those kinds of improvements pay off every day."

THE UNIVERSAL LANGUAGE OF MUSIC

Dr. Cho enjoys seeing the progress of HIU students and alumni, whether they bring him to tears with their musical passion or whether they have followed God's call into music/ worship ministry.

The decreasing attraction to classical music, which is foundational to all musical styles and genres, is a growing challenge for music educators. However, Cho believes that there is an upside to teaching students who do not have a background in classical music.

"They are freer in their thinking, more creative," Dr. Cho comments, adding, "Of course, it is ideal if students can receive the benefits of both classical and contemporary training along the way."

Cho is very aware that alumni of the Music & Worship Arts Department are far greater than the sum of their respective talents. He recalls one outstanding vocalist who went to Africa to work with children orphaned by AIDS, and then returned to the United States to teach at a Christian school. Cho was worried that she was wasting her talent and working for little pay.

"When she said, 'I don't care how much I get paid – God has called me to serve," Cho reflects, "I was suddenly

so proud that we had produced that kind of student from our department."

He is grateful to those who have invested in the work of the HIU Music Department, noting a recent significant donation to the University from **Richard & Annette Atwood**, a gift that was largely motivated by the Atwood's deep appreciation for the education, experience, and supportive community that their son, **James** ('18), received as an HIU student.

"Dr. Cho has been a mentor to our son," said Richard Atwood. "He has a genuine faith and love, and demands that students take responsibility for their faith and talent."

In retrospect, **Dr. Paul Alexander's** ('84, '88) entire life has been preparing him for his new role as Hope International University's seventh President, though he wasn't always aware of it. He was well into his career in academic leadership when then-President **Dr. Leroy Lawson** asked if Dr. Alexander ever envisioned himself becoming a college president one day.

HIU ALUMNUS NOW LEADS THE MARCH Toward the University's Centennial

"I needed to ask myself the question, 'Is this for me?'" said Alexander. "And while I had no specific plans, I began to feel a calling in that direction and began to pray for leadership opportunities." Six years ago, he went through Harvard University's Institutional Education Management certificate program to cultivate the seed that Lawson had planted years prior.

His calling took a definable shape after President Emeritus **Dr. John Derry** announced his planned retirement late last year, and Dr. Alexander felt led to pursue the position. When HIU's Board of Trustees announced their appointment of Dr. Alexander as Dr. Derry's successor, he accepted with humility and gratitude, as well as deep respect and appreciation for his predecessor.

"I am so indebted to John Derry," said Alexander. "His support and graciousness have made the transition very smooth."

Some new presidents step into their office determined to create an entirely new legacy, even at the expense of their predecessors' work. By contrast, Dr. Alexander's vision is to build upon and strengthen HIU's enduring mission, the foundation of the University's ninety-one years of legacy-building.

For Dr. Alexander, mission drives everything, and it's what gets him out of bed every

morning. "This University will hold fast and true to our mission, serving the church and serving the world for Christ."

President Alexander looks forward to helping churches thrive, seeing students launch well, helping the University become more widely known, and helping the Nebraska campus grow and prosper – all goals that are firmly grounded in the University's mission.

"I would love for us to triple our number of ministry students, and to be on the cutting edge of a national Christian University system," he said. "I'd also like to add new programs each year and to seriously investigate the possibility of adding doctoral degrees."

As President Alexander leads the University towards its centennial, he envisions how HIU might look in 2028 and has several ambitious goals to fulfill those dreams:

- Prepare more pastors for churches of all sizes, especially within the Restoration movement, through excellent preparation
- Become well-known for producing exceptional servant leaders from each of HIU's five Colleges
- To take the lead in cooperative partnerships with other colleges, building on President Emeritus John Derry's pioneering leadership, which was central to the 2016 merger with Nebraska Christian College

Formerly HIU's Vice President for Academic Affairs, Dr. Alexander is excited about growth potential in the areas of Psychology and Education and is very proud of how the University has partnered with AVID (Advancement Via Individual Determination). AVID programs in local schools help pave the pathway to higher education for students whose families generally have lower rates of college attendance.

"I was speaking locally about HIU's partnership with AVID, and a teacher from a local junior high school approached me," Alexander recalls. "He said, 'HIU is giving some of my students their only hope!"

Dr. Alexander is the first alumnus to become HIU's President. His personal experience and history at HIU give him a unique perspective, and he loves to hear from fellow alumni and laud their accomplishments. President Alexander plans to develop regional alumni networks to facilitate connections and deepen relationships.

All big jobs come with big challenges, and Alexander notes that limited financial resources and long-term sustainability are the top two.

"We have to manage those challenges while keeping education affordable for students, many of whom represent the first generation of college students in their families," he said.

"Students usually don't meet or even consider the hundreds of donors who give to support their education," he explained. "In my case, my parents paid for part of it and I paid for part of it, but much of it was paid by people I didn't even know – I want our alumni and friends to experience the blessing of being part of that 'much', paying it forward for future generations. "We are always in the process of making new friends, which a good starting point with prospective donors," President Alexander continued. "I will be an active partner with our Institutional Advancement staff, helping to convey how seriously we take stewardship of the resources entrusted to us.

"I want to help people leave their mark, and I firmly believe there is no better investment than future leaders. Who wouldn't want to give to that? We just need to keep ringing the bell, reminding people of the significance of what we are doing here."

ROYALS RECAP 2018-2019 Highlights, Honors, & Achievements

Our outstanding HIU Royals teams and athletes posted a historic year of bests and firsts! (For more, visit hiuroyals.com.)

WOMEN'S SOCCER was seeded fourth in the GSAC and made an incredible run through the tournament to win in the final against Westmont. The Royals advanced to the NAIA Opening Round against #8 Embry Riddle in Prescott, Arizona and fell in overtime 2-3. This was a historic season for the Royals marking the farthest the women's soccer team has gone in the postseason. Captains Leigha Williams (JR/ Fountain Valley, CA) and Jazzmyn Esquivel (SR/Hacienda Heights, CA) were named to the All-American team. Esquivel also

broke the all-time career goals record, and was named HIU Female Co-Athlete of the Year.

MEN'S SOCCER: Two Royals were honored as *All-Conference*, Kyle Pizano (SR/Lake Forest, CA) and Omar Morales (JR/Santa Ana, CA).

WOMEN'S VOLLEYBALL: Jalyssa Sanchez (FR/Whittier, CA) was honored by the **GSAC as Freshman** of the Year.

CROSS COUNTRY: Daphne Solomon was named All-Conference for her performance at the Cross Country GSAC Championships. Joe Tobin (JR/ Brea, CA) broke his own school record and took the Royals the farthest we've ever gone – to our first Cross Country NAIA Championships. **BASKETBALL**: Sophomore Josh Powell-Davis (SO/Oakland, CA) was named *All-American* for his breakout season.

TENNIS: The Royals Tennis program continues to grow and thrive under head coach Mike Longanecker. The men's team was nationally ranked most of the year under the leadership of *GSAC Player of the Year* and *All-American* Kyle Rae (SR/Corby, UK) as well as GSAC Newcomer of the Year Tanishq Mahendru (FR).

GOLF: New Head Coach Dan Mulville brought fresh energy and a focused approach. Both men and women competed in the GSAC tournament with the men finishing 6th and the women finishing 2nd.



Within hours of each other, our Softball team won its second consecutive GSAC Tournament Championship; and Baseball, which has played in the title game three years running, defeated William Jessup to capture its first GSAC Tournament Championship in team history. Dual GSAC Championships for Baseball and Softball this year was an incredible experience for all HIU Royals – athletes and fans alike!



FOR THE SECOND STRAIGHT YEAR, HIU'S **JOHN TUREK** was named gsac athletic director of the year

Capping another banner year for Royals Baseball, two athletes were drafted by Major League Baseball teams: relief pitcher Shaine McNeely (New York Yankees) and starting pitcher Justin Friedman (Chicago White Sox). This marks the first time two HIU athletes have been drafted in the same year, and the first time a pitcher has been drafted from our program.



MEN'S VOLLEYBALL returned to the postseason in 2019, posting its best record to date under Coach Henry Valiente Jr. Three players received *All-Conference* honors: Daniel Bilinski (SR/ Placentia, CA), Nicolas Bilinski (SR/Placentia, CA), and Chase Larson (JR/Henderson, NV).

BASEBALL's bid to the NAIA opening round landed them in Montgomery, Alabama, where they fought through the losers bracket playing 5 games in 50 hours, facing Faulkner University in the final game. They ended their run in the national tournament ranked #25. Founding member of the Royals baseball program, Dominic Potlongo (SR/Placentia, CA), finished his four years at Hope with a bang, throwing the program's first complete game no-hitter. Potlogno was named **GSAC Pitcher of the Year**, earning **Gold Glove** and **All-GSAC** honors, as well as being named **All-American** with his teammate Juan Gonzalez (JR).

SOFTBALL built on its incredible momentum from the previous season under the guidance of coach Dennis Blas and mirrored the men's team with their run through the Southern Oregon Bracket of the NAIA Opening Round in Medford, Oregon. Our Royals lost in the final to the Southern University Oregon Raiders who went on to win the World Series. Senior and Utility Player Anessa Cepeda (SR/Long Beach, CA) was honored as an *All-American* and along with Bree Maikai (SR/Oak Hills, CA), Melanie Okazaki (JR/Cerritos, CA), Taylor Pierce (SR/Norwalk, CA) and Jamie Ponce (SO/Escondido, CA) made up the Royals *All-GSAC* team. The Royals finished their unprecedented season ranked #11 in the nation.

TRACK (DISTANCE): Joe Tobin not only qualified to compete in the National Championship Cross Country meet in Iowa, but also in the Marathon at the NAIA Track and Field Championships in Alabama, finishing 27th in the nation.



STANDOUT STUDENT ATHLETE LEIGHA WILLIAMS

Current Vice President of HIU's Student Government Association, **Leigha Williams**, is a born leader. Last year, as the only non-senior captain on the HIU Royals Women's Soccer team, and holding one of the highest cumulative GPA's of any student athlete (3.85), Leigha was honored by the Golden State Athletic Conference for her stellar scholarship, character, and citizenship.

Leigha's presence on the field makes a tremendous difference for her team, which went as far as it has ever gone last season, largely due to Leigha's playing ability and the culture she helped shape on and off the pitch. Williams leads spiritual small groups with her teammates as well as weekly study groups to help herself and others boost their schoolwork. She participated in the Human to Human club, focused on making sandwiches for the homeless, and has been active in the Fellowship for Christian Athletes. Leigha has given back to her favorite sport by

contributing to NHB Academy Nights at Hope View School where she taught and demonstrated soccer skills and drills, facilitated a 7-week soccer training for 8-9 year-old boys, modeled sportsmanship, and assisted and collaborated with coaches.

She has been active with **Night to Shine**, an unforgettable Prom Night founded for the special needs community.

As a soccer captain again this season, Leigha's soccer team will contiue to be lifted up by her indomitable spirit and the incredible work ethic and attitude that has made Williams such a special athlete, teammate, friend, and human.

As a 2-year captain, **Kayla Bloodworth**'s leadership extended far beyond the basketball court. Bloodworth has a heart for ministry and kids and interned with the children's ministry at a local church. TEAM GUATAMALA

An inside look at the Sentinels



For the past six years, Nebraska Christian College has been nurturing a relationship with the Prince of Peace church in Guatemala, sending a team of students and staff every year over that span. The teams support the local Guatemalan ministries, and share the love of Christ with those they meet along the way. One NCC alum even relocated there as a full-time missionary.

Dr. Andrew Wood, who led the trip this year, explained how the groups have partnered with the church and schools in the area, providing food for students and praying with students and teachers, answering questions about what it means to follow Jesus. He considers it a great privilege for NCC teams be able to work alongside the thriving Guatemalan church to establish a sustainable ministry.

"I am deeply impressed with the Guatemalan Christian Church, how they are reaching their community and even sending out missionaries to Argentina."

For freshman Sentinels Men's Soccer player Dakota Fox (back *row, fourth from right*), this was his first mission experience, first time out of the country, and even first time flying. Dakota remembers the feeling as his team landed and left the airport, seeing dozens of locals standing outside the airport to watch as foreigners arrived. As the team loaded up in the bus and began driving through Guatemala, Dakota was trying to absorb as much of the Guatemalan culture as he could.

Dakota recounted some of his highlights from the Guatemala trip, sharing stories about the people that he met. One particular little school boy stood out to him. The team visited his school and brought pizza for the students. This little boy clung to Dakota from the moment he got there until it was time to leave. They talked, played, laughed and prayed together. When Dakota left, he felt something in his pocket; the little boy had snuck his bracelet into Dakota's pocket

without Dakota knowing. Dakota was overwhelmed, knowing how little the boy had, and yet he gave Dakota one of his few possessions.

The experience reminded Dakota that when you serve and love others, often you may experience much more love in return from the people you are serving than vou could ever offer to them. He said he learned, "Let God do what He's going to do, and He will lead you in the ways that He has for you. He will put the right people in your path. And remember, it's no accident that you're interacting with the people you meet."

This year, NCC students served on mission trips to Guatemala, Houston and Omaha. Please continue to pray for our students as they serve in their communities and around the world, sharing the gospel and making an impact for Christ.



STUDY ABROAD

Students from our CA and NE campuses - Desiree Chance (NCC), Brianna Gamez, Joshua McBride, Katy McGuire, Claire Murphy (NCC), and Herminia Perez-Jiminez – traveled to Belize for an immersive 10-day educational experience studying tropical ecosystems and organisms firsthand. In addition to field trips to the Smithsonian Institution Marine Research Station on Carrie Bow Caye, and the Tobacco Caye Marine Station. The group also enjoyed multiple snorkling opportunities, encountering sea turtles, nurse sharks, spotted eagle rays, and other local marine life. The group spent five days in the lowland broadleaf rainforest and three days in the savanna wetlands.

"Studying in Belize was much more than just an awesome and adventurous opportunity to earn 4 units of lab science credit. This trip allowed us to see God, the Creator, in a new light," reported HIU junior, Katy McGuire. "In just 10 days, we were able to visit four very different ecosystems. By the end of this trip, we returned with a new appreciation and understanding of tropical ecosystems and organisms."

HIU offers this immersive study abroad experience as a 4-unit course, *Tropical Ecosystems with Lab.* The trip was coordinated and led by HIU Assistant Professor of Science **Karen McReynolds** with assistance from the Tobacco Caye Marine Station, who led the marine unit of the course. "It was fabulous to meet with the actual scientists who write the peerreviewed papers we had been summarizing all week," adds Professor McReynolds.

In February, a team of NCC students traveled to Houston, TX, with an organization called 12Two Missions.
